KEY AREAS OF LEARNING

As Historians we will

Place the Tudors on a historical timeline and understand its relevance to the modern day.
To understand some of the experiences of people in the Tudor era
To find out about significant people during the Tudor era.

As Scientists we will

Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat.
Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement

As Artists and Design Technologists we will

Take part in creating art inspired by the Tudors
Explore Tudor art using a range of different media.

LITERACY

Explore an artists interpretation of a significant event during the Tudor era.

Develop a love of reading, reading fluency and comprehension.

Class text will inspire writing in a range of genres including: Eye-witness account, non-chronological reports, play scripts, instructional writing.

MATHEMATICS

Making the links between the four operations in the context of problem solving.

Focus on exploring and understanding efficient methods for all four operations, including expanded and compact column methods building on last term's conceptual work, and the beginnings of grid multiplication and division by chunking.

COMPUTING

Developing an understanding of algorithms and debugging through the use of the Scratch programme. Computing is also embedded across the curriculum.

PE

Focusing on cooperative games, we will develop our team spirit. Through team games such as hockey children will develop a range of key skills, such as, agility, coordination and ball skills.

RE

To explore the impact Jewish/Hindu beliefs have on the life of a child through story telling, discussion and debate.

MUSIC

Appreciate and understand a wide range of high-quality live and recorded music drawn from different traditions and from great composers . Develop an understanding of the history of music.
