- Life Cycles of Plants and Animals.

Inquiry Question and summary of project

Do we have the power to change the world?

How Can We Feed 10 Billion?

Focussing on how food is grown, harvested and consumed today and how it could change for the better in the future; the impact it has on our world and investigating what we can do to reduce waste and improve health, starting with our own community.

Suggestions for support at home

- Encourage your child to consider the food they eat and where it comes from in the world, which food has travelled the furthest and which has been produced locally.
- Discuss your favourite foods and recipes and how they have developed since your childhood.
- Talk about the role food plays in your culture.
- Plan, prepare and cook a new recipe together.

Reading The Year 5 text this term is *Wolf Brother* by Michelle Paver, the story of a young boy and his wolf-cub companion surviving in the wild, foraging for food and learning about their environment. We will continue to develop comprehension and inference skills using a variety of texts and picture books.

Spelling/Phonics

In Year 5 the students will continue to work through the Read, Write, Inc (RWI) programme. Their weekly spellings will be linked to the current unit within RWI.

Number Facts

Continue to focus on all the times tables up to 12 x 12, aiming for rapid recall or a way of working them out. In class the focus will be on Place Value, Addition & Subtraction, Multiplication and Division.
